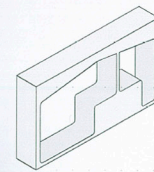


Modules for the daily routine

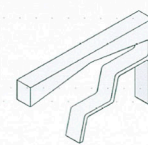
Madrid-based architect **Zoco Estudio** has transformed this 36 m² (388 ft²) apartment as a kind of a tribute to Le Corbusier's Modular Man. Aiming to change the traditional structure of the bedroom, the architect has created a series of modular units designed around the sequence of the daily routine. Five different modules provide space for sleeping, working, bathing, dressing, and leisure activities, such as listening to music or reading. The modules containing more private activities, such as showering or sleeping, are located on the peripheral areas of the room, while those with a more communal function are situated in the center or are orientated outwards to face the windows. Mirrored walls, wooden floors, and glass mosaics on each of the units provide a consistent design aesthetic.



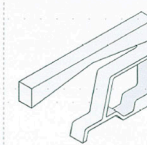

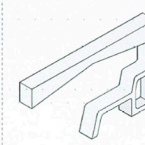

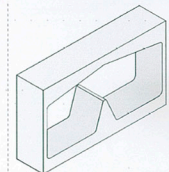
